

**THE MINUTES OF THE REGULAR MEETING
OF THE EXETER TOWNSHIP BOARD OF SUPERVISORS
MONDAY, DECEMBER 4TH, 2023, AT 7:00 PM**

ADMINISTRATION

The Exeter Township Board of Supervisors held their regular monthly meeting on Monday, December 4th, 2023, at 7:00 PM in the Township Municipal Building. Present were Supervisors Pendolphia, Felker, Fetch, and Chairperson Redmond along with Attorney Molino and the secretary. Supervisor Kreseski was absent.

Motion by Fetch, seconded by Felker to accept the reading of the Regular Meeting with all voting in favor.

Motion by Fetch, seconded by Pendolphia to accept the reading of the Special Meeting with all voting in favor.

Motion to accept the reading of the Treasurer's Report by Fetch, seconded by Pendolphia. Vote – All yes.

There were no comments from the floor on Agenda Items.

The monthly bills were reviewed by the supervisors prior to the start of the meeting. Motion by Fetch, seconded by Pendolphia with all in favor to approve and pay the bills apart from a bill from Atlas for \$2,000.

Chairperson Redmond informed residents there was an Executive Session held on November 20th, 2023, regarding legal matters.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS

Motion to deny choosing location of a yard waste dump by Pendolphia, seconded by Fetch with all voting in favor.

NEW BUSINESS

Chairperson Redmond informed residents the January Reorganization Meeting and Township Meeting will be held on Tuesday, January 2nd, 2024, at 7:00 PM due to the holiday.

Motion to accept Dick Peck's resignation as Township Auditor by Fetch, seconded by Pendolphia with all voting in favor.

REPORTS

Chief Turner from Wyoming Area Regional Police was present to answer resident questions and advised there was 41 calls for Exeter Township in the month of October.

Harding/Mt Zion Ambulance reported **1** call.

Mt Zion Fire Company reported **23** calls.

Harding Fire Company reported **7** calls.

There were no sewage or zoning reports provided in time of the meeting.

Mike Santi – Wilson Ave questioned whether yard waste can be dumped in the baseball field

Ben Gadomski – State Route 92 questioned if property on Mt Zion could be utilized for a yard waste dump site

Donna Swainbank – State Route 92 advised ice has been accumulating at the bottom of her driveway on 92. She stated this has been an ongoing issue that she has been reaching out to PA State Representative Aaron Kaufer’s office regarding.

Johnathan Williams – State Route 92 also complained of ice on 92 and advised he has been filing complaints to PennDOT
