

**THE MINUTES OF THE REGULAR MEETING
OF THE EXETER TOWNSHIP BOARD OF SUPERVISORS
MONDAY, OCTOBER 8TH, 2024, AT 7:00 PM**

ADMINISTRATION

The Exeter Township Board of Supervisors held their regular monthly meeting on Monday, October 8th, 2024, at 7:00 PM in the Township Municipal Building. Present were Supervisors Pendolphia, Felker, Fetch and Chairperson Redmond along with Attorney Molino and the secretary.

Motion by Pendolphia, seconded by Fetch to approve the reading of the regular meeting minutes. Vote – All yes.

Motion by Fetch, seconded by Felker to accept the reading of the Treasurer’s Report with all voting in favor.

There were no comments from the floor on Agenda items.

The monthly bills were reviewed by the Supervisors prior to the start of the meeting. Motion by Pendolphia, seconded by Felker with all voting in favor to approve and pay the bills.

Chairperson Redmond informed residents there was an executive session held October 8th at 6:00 pm in the Municipal Building regarding personnel and litigation.

NEW BUSINESS

Motion to approve a joint defense strategy with Exeter Borough, West Wyoming Borough, Wyoming Borough, and the Wyoming Area Regional Police Commission relative to West Pittston’s lawsuit filed in the Luzerne County Court of Common Pleas at Number 2024-00847, and to approve the hiring of Rosenn Jenkins and Greenwald to represent the joint defendants, with said legal representation to be managed and billed through the Wyoming Area Regional Police Commission and its cost sharing structure. Motion by Fetch, seconded by Pendolphia with all voting in favor.

REPORTS

Officer Neff was present from Wyoming Area Regional Police and reported there had been 443 police calls in the month of September.

Mt Zion Fire Company reported 22 calls in the month of September.

There were three building permits filed.

RESIDENT QUESTIONS/COMMENTS

Chairperson Redmond informed residents the Township sent out correspondence to PPL, Frontier, and Comcast regarding the number of trees down on wires within the township.

Bill Stout – Bishop Lane – Questioned if the board was getting rid of the ambulance.

Linda Stout – Bishop Lane – Thanked the Supervisors for working with the ambulance.

Joe Panzitta – State Route 92 – Expressed concern of a telephone pole within the township that is ready to fall.

Art Becker – Schooley Rd – Thanked Supervisors for the use of the Municipal Building for the Harding Recreation Committee's Touch a Truck event.
